## Christian Community Center

The Congregational Church of Salem has been an integral part of the Salem community since 1728 and played a vital role in the 1819 establishment of the Town of Salem. Two hundred and eighty-one years later, the church still understands its role not only as a congregation within a community, but as a group that can be a blessing to the entire community – thus the construction of the Christian Community Center.

The former ACE Machine building was purchased in 2003. It took six years to complete the process of determining the best use for the site and conduct proper due diligence to obtain all permits. As part of the process, a change from the original plans to renovate moved to the current plans for demolition and new construction. Thus, the Christian Community Center will be built to provide needed church facilities.
